SITE DESCRIPTION:

A small derelict weatherboard cottage with a corrugated iron hipped roof, situated on a steep cleared hillside on the western side of the Ragged Tier. The hut has a central doorway with a single window on either side.

HISTORY:

The hut is on 62 acres of land selected by C Tatnell IN 1864 under the Waste Land Acts of the mid nineteenth century. Probably an early selector's hut, it is now used as a hay shed.
