SITE DESCRIPTION:

A good example of Edwardian house design illustrating many of the typical design features of the period including the use of twin gable form with projecting gable ends, the return verandah between the gables, restrained timber detailing, finely detailed verandah enclosure with half glazing and a rare surviving (but poor condition) front fence of decorative wire on a timber frame.

HISTORY:

Lived in between the 1920s and 1950s by Peter Hindrum, a Norwegian fisherman who came to Dunalley on board ship and remained.

BOUNDARY:

The listing boundary is formed by the boundary of the Dunalley conservation precinct.

COMMENTS:

The house and fence are good examples of the Edwardian housing style that was prevalent throughout the Municipality.
