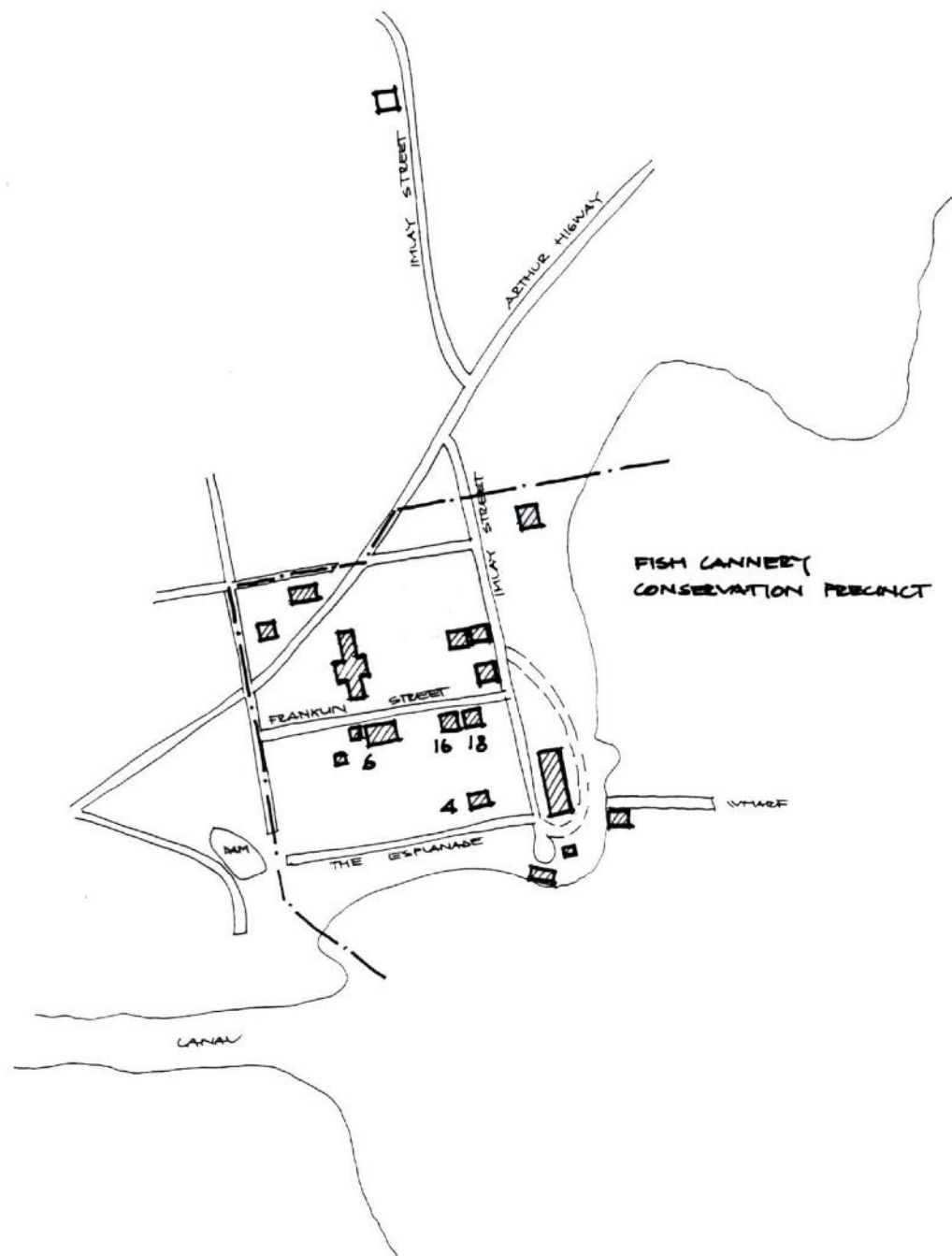

SITE DESCRIPTION: A simple interwar house of vertical timber siding with a corrugated iron roof, part of a small group of residences constructed for the manager and staff of the fish canning factory adjacent. The house demonstrates typical construction techniques and building style of the period and not widely seen in the area. It features a brick chimney, hipped roof construction, cover strips to timber boarding and is set on a brick base.			
HISTORY: Built during World War II for the manager of the Fish Cannery of Tasmania operation in Dunalley and the cannery's workers.			
BOUNDARY: The listing boundary is formed by the boundary of the Dunalley Fish Cannery conservation precinct.			
COMMENTS: The building is significant as part of a group of buildings that while not individually of high significance, form an important precinct in relation to the fish canning activities that were the main industry of the town. The building indicates the form of construction used during the war with material shortages and austerity. It should be included in the Sorell Planning Scheme as part of the Dunalley Fish Cannery conservation precinct.
