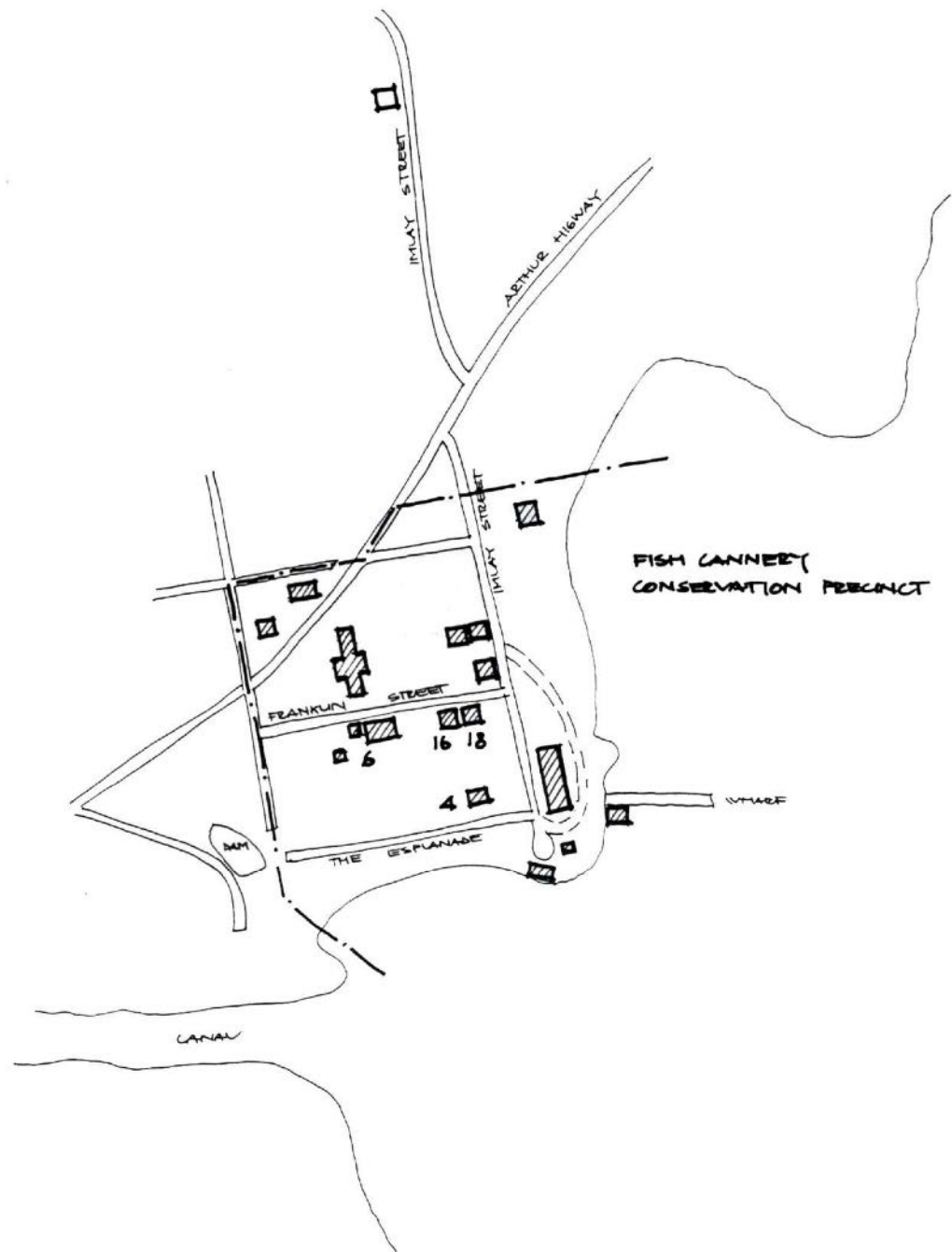

SITE DESCRIPTION: A smaller timber building on the foreshore related to the canning works and fishing industry. The building is timber clad in vertical boards on a concrete base with some retaining on the water's edge. The structure is unpretentious.			
HISTORY: Unknown			
BOUNDARY: The listing boundary is formed by the site on which the building stands, the rear of the Tasman Monument behind and an area extending 10 metres from each end of the building and forms part of the Dunalley Fish Cannery conservation precinct.			
COMMENTS: The building and site have some significance as representative of the major industry in Dunalley over a long period which was the centre of town activity and employment and for which a number of other buildings were constructed to house staff. The buildings indicate the operation of the canning works and the relationship to the water, jetty and ancillary functions. The site also has significance as the decline of the fishing industry paralleled the decline of the town. It should be included in Schedule 3 of the Sorell Planning Scheme.
