SITE DESCRIPTION:

An early road route between the Orielton and Pawleena valleys whose form clearly demonstrates the early grant boundaries.

HISTORY:

The route was clearly in use by 1830 when Governor Arthur used it during the so called Black Line. The rough route from near Wood's Farm west features a small dogleg which is the result of a longstanding boundary dispute between William Wood and Jacob Billett.

BOUNDARY:

The listing boundary is formed by the road reserve.

COMMENTS:

The route has significance as an early land route in the district which clearly demonstrates the evolution of land alienation in the district by delineating early grant boundaries.

The route should be listed in Schedule 3 of the Sorell Planning Scheme.
