SITE DESCRIPTION:

A very fine stand of macrocarpas lining the edge of the highway and forming a barrier between the house and the road. The trees of some antiquity were planted for the earlier house which stood adjacent to the present house and clearly delineate the landscape by defining the garden and front paddock area of the house. They are one of the key visual items along the highway and are of high heritage value for their landscape importance.
