SITE DESCRIPTION:

The replacement hall built in 1966 after the fire destroyed the earlier building. Built of concrete block with a flat metal deck roof, the building is nondescript.

HISTORY:

The first hall was opened c1916 after three years planning by a local committee. It was destroyed during the 1967 bushfires and rebuilt afterwards with some government assistance.
