SITE DESCRIPTION:

A plain c1860 single storey weatherboard house with a gabled corrugated iron roof, a skillion rear section and two rendered chimneys. The front verandah has been enclosed and an enclosed porch constructed on the southern side. There are said to be handmade nails in flooring installed in the roof space. The southern and northern gables have been clad in pseudo brick sheeting.

The property also has a deteriorating timber barn, dating to around the turn of the century.

HISTORY:

The house is on land originally granted to R W Loane and later part of John Wade's land. The property was later owned by the Iles family and has been in the Wagner family since the 1930s.

BOUNDARY:

The listing boundary is formed by the fences around the immediate house block.

COMMENTS:

Bridge Farm has significance as one of the earliest houses in Sorell and is in a landmark location at the southern end of the main part of the Sorell township.

The house should be included in Schedule 3 of the Sorell Planning Scheme.
