SITE DESCRIPTION:

A timber girder bridge the deck span of which is supported on a system of corbels and half caps set into the side of the pile tops and bolted to them. The piles, in turn, are braced against loads resulting from running water by wales or diagonal members bolted to the faces of the piles.

HISTORY:

BOUNDARY:

The listing boundary encompasses the bridge and extends for a distance of fifty metres up and down stream from the bridge.

COMMENTS:

In a Statewide context timber bridges can be considered rare on the National Highway and State classified road networks. In contrast, it is understood that timber bridges are still relatively common on the local government road network, particularly in rural areas where traffic volume and load bearing requirements are generally less than in built up areas. Notwithstanding this, there is a general trend across the board to upgrade bridges using permanent materials such as pre-cast concrete. The timber bridge form is sympathetic to the rural character of the surrounding area and highly visible examples should be retained where possible.

It should be included in Schedule 3 of the Sorell Planning Scheme.
