SITE DESCRIPTION:

A new jetty comprising a stone gabion seawall structure projecting into the estuary with a small T-shaped wharf at the end with four timber posts supporting it. The structure replaces an early wharf on the site and has links with the use of the waterways for transport and movement of goods during last century and early this century.

HISTORY:

An early photograph of the site shows a small timber T-shaped jetty located closer to the shore with a series of small timber buildings located on it and on the shore. All evidence of the early structures have now gone. The area was known as lower Pittwater early in its history.
