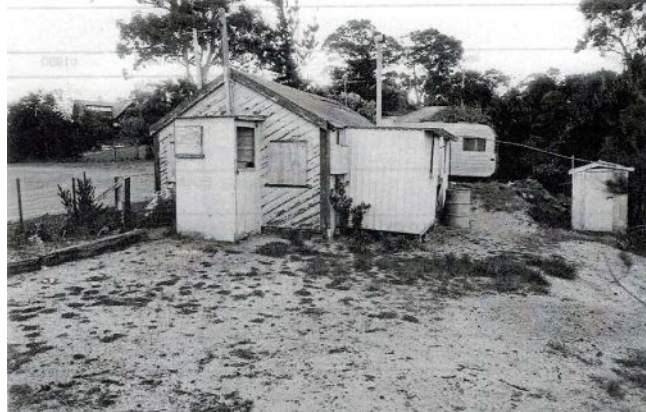

SITE DESCRIPTION: A small timber beachside shack, one of the earlier in the district that typifies the early development of the area for holiday use. It is either a one or two room structure, located on the edge of the cliff to the beach and has a detached toilet. It has been altered over time to accommodate changing needs and has additional space in the form of a caravan on the site.			
HISTORY: One of the few surviving small scale holiday shacks that once were found extensively following the initial sub-division of the area.			
BOUNDARY:			
COMMENTS: The shack is broadly representative of many seaside holiday shacks and residences that once proliferated through the area and which have been more recently redeveloped with permanent or more substantial accommodation. Whilst not having aesthetic or architectural merit it indicates a pattern of development that is rapidly disappearing from coastal areas.
