SITE DESCRIPTION:

A plain weatherboard cottage with a gabled corrugated iron roof featuring decorative barge boards. The building has elaborate external architraves, an external brick chimney and a verandah on the road frontage. Several windows have been removed and in filled with weather boards.

The hit is built in front of the site of an earlier farmhouse, whose foundations are still evident. There is a modern shed behind and several rock terraces.

HISTORY:

The hit is located on Christian Bender's 32 acre selection in 1861 under the Waste Lands Act and is said to have been moved to the site many years ago after the original farmhouse was burnt down. It is believed to have been the kitchen of the former Kellevie church or hall, although this could not be confirmed on site.
