SITE DESCRIPTION:

A low earth causeway constructed by the local community to provide access to Marion Bay. There are two timber bridges, both supplied by the Sorell Municipal Council, on the causeway.

HISTORY:

The causeway was built in the 1930s as a result of members of the community volunteering time and labour for its construction. The engineer was Walter Ford, manager of the Bream Creek Butter Factory.

BOUNDARY:

The listing boundary is formed by the edges and ends of the causeway.

COMMENTS:

The causeway has significance as a reflection of community action to volunteer time and labour to build a public roadway

It should be listed in Schedule 3 of the Sorell Planning Scheme.
